Determination, self-motivation and discipline are required to keep up with deadlines in this coursework based subject.

University requirements	Students often apply to go onto a Foundation Course to help them specialise before their Arts degree: Application is via: Portfolio of work and 1 GCE A Level / AVCE / BTEC National Diploma / GNVQ Advanced Diploma supported by 3 GCSEs grade C or above. Other students choose a 4 year course : Minimum entry criteria of 160 UCAS tariff points, 80 of which must be from an art/design related subject and four GCSE passes at grade C or above, including English. For Art college, most students will be asked to bring a portfolio of work, mainly from Year 12 studies and Life Drawing Classes.
Related courses and careers	Art and Design is relevant and at times necessary for any of the creative industries. These include: Architecture, Website Design, Product Design, Interior Design, Engineering, Industrial Design, Graphic Design, Advertising, Computer Graphics, Typography Design, Photography, Printmaking, Film/TV/Audio/Visual Illustration, Technical Illustration, Design and Computer studies, Design and Business Management, Fashion Design, Fashion Design and Business Management, Design History and Research, Film/Media, Animation Special effects for film, Textiles, Leather Design, Footwear Design, Set Design, Fashion Illustration, Fashion Promotion, Costume Design, Conservation and Restoration, Mural Design, Stained Glass Design, Ceramics, Jewellery Design, Gallery Curator, Art Management, Art History, Painting, Sculpture, Art Teaching, University Lecturer, Web Design, Primary School Teacher NB Art and Design is a requirement for Fashion Design. It is not possible to gain a place on most courses with Textiles alone.
Other Details	Students are expected to visit galleries, museums and various exhibitions linked to their topic areas. Although the school supplies many materials the students are required to pay for canvas, board, sketchbooks and a range of drawing materials which are sold on at cost. Students will be offered Life Drawing Classes at Townley Grammar, with minimal charge to pay for a model. These classes will be held after school, and it is largely expected that most students will attend.
